


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




EVENT INFORMATION

<u>VERY IMPORTANT</u>: There will be ACT testing going on in the front of the building. It is IMPERATIVE that teams park in the assigned parking lot AND enter the building through the Auxiliary Gymnasium (FOLLOW THE SIGNS!). No teams or visitors will be allowed to enter the building in the morning through the front or cafeteria doors.

<u>Arrival</u>: It is important that all teams <u>show up on time</u> and <u>report to the check-in table</u> immediately upon arrival. This will allow us to make the match schedule quickly. Please call 862-432-1526 if you are going to be late.

<u>Event Location:</u> Livingston High School is located at 30 Robert Harp Drive in Livingston, NJ. The event will take place in the Auxiliary Gym which is located on the Madonna Dr. side of the building in the rear. Please follow FTC – FIRST Robotics signage as you turn onto the oval in front of the school for parking and entrance to the gym. Access into the building will be through the REAR AUXILIARY GYM ENTRANCE (Madonna Rd. side) of the school. Lunch will be served in the cafeteria.



<u>Pit Area</u>: The Pits will be located in the Auxiliary Gym area. It is located in the rear of the building and will be marked. Teams wishing to drop robots and materials off can do so via the entrance on Madonna Drive. Parking ordinances are strictly enforced in town, so be sure to follow traffic signs!

Please stay within the boundaries of your pit and be kind to your neighbors. If you have large banners, displays, or posters, we can find a space in the arena for these items. The Pit Areas should stay clear of obstructions to traffic and NO Team networks are allowed in the Pit. We will have a Pit Router set up for the use of all.

Queuing: Per usual, Queuers will work with adult Lead Queuers to help teams to move from the Pit Area to the Competition Area in time for matches. Per usual, we will likely queue ~2 matches ahead and ask that those Drive Teams / Bots standby in Queuing Hold Area (designated at the venue.)

EVENT INFORMATION (continued)

What to Bring:

Supplies: Be sure to bring a Utility Strip. Safety Glasses, Battery Chargers (marked with Team Number) and spare parts.

<u>Consent Forms</u>: Please be prepared to submit your STIMS Summary Sheet at Team Check In. This is a requirement for each team member. Use of STIMS is really preferred, however, hard copy FIRST Consent Forms will be at Check In, as a last resort. There is also a blank Consent form as the last page of this Information Packet for our non-Team Volunteers.

<u>SAFETY GLASSES</u> for your participants is a top priority. We will expect teams to wear this important safety item. Also, remember to bring a multi-outlet utility strip to assure that you can bring power to a convenient spot on your Pit table. It is good practice to bring spare batteries and other critical parts, as well as a battery charger. Be sure to mark your materials with your team number so that they don't get mixed with those of another team.

<u>Judged Awards</u>: The full set of awards will be given out at the December 14th Qualifier. We expect to have six panels of Judges. Your team will be assigned a Judge Interview time immediately upon registration. We are attempting to accomplish ALL of the judged interviews BEFORE the start of Qualification Matches. It is important that teams arrive between 7:30 and 8:00 ... and really abide by the interview time that they are given.

Note – The interviews are being conducted in the hallway connecting the Auxiliary Gym to the Cafeteria. Please follow appropriate signage.

<u>Match Lists:</u> We are often asked "when will Match Lists be available?". They will be handed out ~9:45. The information will be available sooner if all teams are able to pass inspection earlier.

<u>Inspection</u>: Bring your robot to Inspection IMMEDIATELY upon arriving. This is always THE pacing element in getting the competition started on time. Please help.

<u>Alliance Partners</u> Since we have 36 teams participating in this official tournament, we will be following FIRST rules regarding 3-team (not 2-team) Alliances. Following the completion of Qualification Matches, we will form four 3-Team Alliances to participate in the Elimination Matches. It is up to the Alliance Captain to assure that each alliance team plays in at least one of the best-of-three matches.

Robot Marking

Remember to have your team numbers on the robot in large size, per specification. That sometimes does not happen early in the season. So too, make sure that your robot accommodates the mounting of the Alliance Flag.

EVENT INFORMATION (continued)

<u>Volunteers</u> – We are finishing up staffing of the event. Help from teams relative to any position is very welcome. Got an adult to spare? See us at Check-In or drop us a line asap.

Lunch:

Pre-Order Forms should be turned in at the time of Team Check In or shortly thereafter. – approximately 9:30 am on event day. As with all of the competitions, the food will be very reasonably priced and we ask that teams support our host by purchasing their lunch on site, rather than bringing their own or ordering out.

Food: Snacks and beverages will be available at a modest cost throughout the day.

Please go to the Pit Administration table for basic First Aid Supplies. Please alert the event organizers if more involved care is required.

Safety expectations and rules at this Scrimmage are the same as for all FIRST events. Please refer to the FIRST manual for those standards.


GENERAL CONDUCT

Please notify an Event Crew member if you have any safety issues or concerns. Please report any illness or injuries to the Pit Administration table or event organizers.




